I am honored to become the next president of The Krenov Foundation board. I would like to thank my predecessor, Paul Reiber, for his leadership the past few years and his help to keep the foundation focused on its mission throughout the pandemic.

Spring is a busy season at The Krenov Foundation and The Krenov School. The class of 2023 is pushing to finish their projects for the graduation show next month, applications for next year's class have been reviewed, tough decisions have been made, and scholarships have been awarded to those in need of financial support.

I would like to thank our scholarship committee that makes the difficult decisions regarding award recipients. Their hard work allows the foundation to fulfill the most satisfying part of the mission, giving money to those that need it most.

Over the relatively short history of The Krenov Foundation we have been able to award nearly \$240,000 in scholarships and awards. This year the foundation increased the size of the scholarships that it awards to compensate for the rising costs encountered by students attending the program. I am happy to announce that The Krenov Foundation has awarded \$68,000 this year to incoming students for both the summer programs and the 9-month program. This is an

impressive sum and a significant increase over previous years.

Alphonse Mattia

I want to note the passing to Alphonse Mattia earlier this spring.

Although I was never fortunate enough to meet or study with him, his work had a large impact on my own. The first of his works that caught my attention were the valet chairs done in the mid 1980's soon after I had graduated from the Krenov School.

His whimsical approach to chairs and his emphasis on their anthropomorphic possibilities opened up for me a new and broader vision of the sculptural possibilities inherent in the chair form.

Alphonse taught at Virginia Commonwealth University, Boston University Program in Artisanry, and Rhode Island School of Design. Among

his many students was Wendy
Maruyama whose "Mickey MacIntosh
Chair" done in 1980 connected the
Scottish designer Charles MacIntosh's
high back chairs with contemporary pop
culture and the burgeoning Studio
Furniture Movement.

In the mid 1980's Alfonse responded to a client's request for a valet chair with a series of high backed chairs with heads and shoulders and such titles as "Mr. Potatohead," "City Boy" and "Primates."

I had done a MacIntosh inspired High backed caned chair with a carved crest rail while at school and continued exploring the chair in the early 80's. Seeing the valet chairs as well as the work coming out of the Studio Furniture Movement that challenged so many of the traditional approaches to furniture encouraged me to continue exploring the chair form.

Soon heads and hands began appearing on my chairs as well as non-symmetrical stances as I worked to introduce narrative content and commentary into my work.

Mattia's mirrors, complex and sculptural, further challenged the traditional categories of functional and nonfunctional, opening up an avenue for a broader and more artistic approach to furniture design. The mirror itself becoming almost an excuse for a colorful cubist construction.
